### Evidence to support Application

T1 is a large Yew tree in the garden of Fir Court House, Fir Court Avenue, Church Stoke, SY15 6BA. The tree is in good health, but does cause a nuisance to the light levels within the property.

The applicant appeals to the council to allow the owners of T1 to heavily reduce the canopy to the main bowl at 4 meters. This would mean reducing the crown by half or about 3-4 meters to the lower younger trimmed growth. This degree of pruning is to encourage T1 to promote growth at a lower height, so the regrowth can be pruned into topiary. This regrowth will be pruned each year creating a tight formed crown which will ultimately end up becoming a large piece of cloud pruned topiary.

With this course of action the tree can be retained and still add aesthetic value to its location and give more light into the property.

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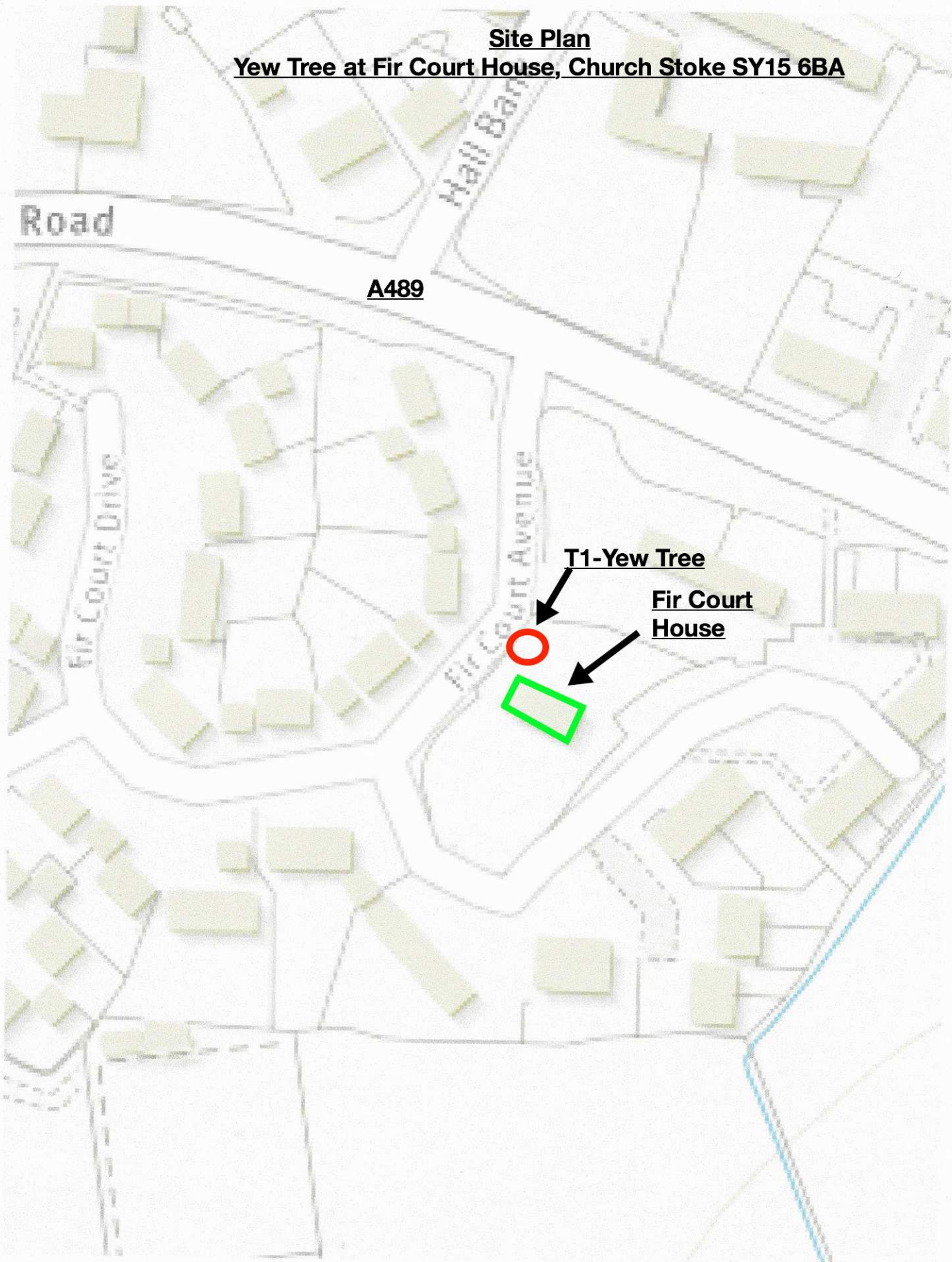
